## Eskdaleside-cum-Ugglebarnby Parochial Church Council

### Project:

All Saints Ugglebarnby tower repairs

### Subject:

Facilities and building improvements

### Location:

Whitby, North Yorkshire

### Overview:

All Saints’ Ugglebarnby Church, situated 2km from Sirius Minerals’ Woodsmith Mine was built in 1872 to replace a Norman chapel. It is noted for an unusual and beautifully decorated roof, a stained glass window showing Judas Iscariot with his purse, a fine reredos depicting the Last Supper carved in Caen stone and a Holdich organ in a teak case.

£1,000 was awarded to the church council for repair works to the church tower, including new flashings and gutter repairs, re-pointing to the parapet and upper levels and new louvres to the belfry openings.
